Dear Ministry Partners,

Do you believe that God is trustworthy? Have you ever adamantly affirmed that belief and then found yourself full of anxiety over

something that He alone is in control of? I wish that that weren't true, but I confess that I'm quilty, especially every spring when I head toward our family reunion in Missouri and have to cross "Tornado Alley."

June 1 I returned from a 2700-mile journey to a great family reunion with my brothers and their spouses, some of their family members, and several cousins. On the return trip I visited a supporting church in New Mexico, speaking at a ladies' retreat and giving two ministry reports. Every mile of the way God graciously protected His fearful child, withholding the things I had feared and seeing me through an extremely heavy downpour that lasted about a half hour. I thank and praise Him for being such a gracious Father and know that should He ever allow what seems to me to be "the worst," He's still in control and has our good and His glory in mind. I long to grow in my trust. "He's still working on me!"

Our aviation department has done a helicopter feasibility study in areas with no airstrips and believes that outreach could be increased four-fold if it had a helicopter. Please pray for wisdom and necessary funds.
